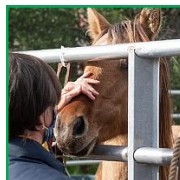

Mādahòkì Farm

Equine-assisted learning centred on the Ojibwe Spirit Horse help Indigenous youth reconnect with culture, identity, and community.



Reconciliation Through Art

The Métis Artist Collective brings Indigenous and non-Indigenous communities together through art, storytelling, and cultural experiences.



Isaruit Inuit Arts

Workshops bring Inuit youth and elders together to share traditional arts including sewing, sculpture, toolmaking and visual arts.



Kateri Native Ministry

Hosts retreats and programs to foster healing and spiritual growth within the local Indigenous community, including a week celebrating the Algonquin language.
